CHRISTMAS

As a child, back home in Indiana, Christmas was not celebrated by my father. But my mother did. We had peanut brittle, oranges and other good things to eat. I got Christmas presents but I suspected that Christmas should not be celebrated because of my father. He was a Jehovah's Witness and I tended to follow his lead. When he died, I was a junior in High School and I began to rethink my opposition to Christmas and the good things it represented.

However, I understood the pagan origin of the Holiday. I knew that Christmas was not the Lord's birthday and that there should be no religious connotation to the event. It was a national holiday, though, and a special day to be shared with friends and family.

The apostle Paul told the Galatians "You observe days and months and seasons and years. I am afraid for you, lest I have labored for you in vain" (Gal. 4:10-11). Doubtless, Paul refers to unauthorized religious observances with special mandatory religious significance. We would certainly desire to avoid following the Galatians' example. Therefore, we should examine our motives and avoid practicing something condemned by Paul. Then, can we in good conscience observe Christmas? Christmas is a religious observance of the birth of Christ as viewed by most religious denominations. Christmas is also a national secular holiday just as Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. Christmas provides a time for family activities the same as Labor Day, for example.

Should Christmas be celebrated as the birth of Christ? I don't think so for there are no scriptures to support that. The practice did not originate with God's word.

Do we have authority to engage in the non-religious traditions surrounding Christmas? There are many non-religious traditions that are approved by God. We can give gifts, spend time with family, eat and take time off from work.

If you cannot celebrate Christmas with a clear conscience then do not do it (Rom. 14: 22, 23).

But do not condemn those who celebrate it non-religiously and in good conscience. We need to distinguish between religious practices and sharing a holiday with family. The former is condemned while the latter is approved.
