Calling Evil Good ...

Isaiah records a warning from God to Israel that is certainly applicable to our world today ...

Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter! (Isaiah 5:20 NKJV)

This is one of many scriptures in which God has spoken with alarming clarity on the subject of evil. The entire Bible, after the entrance of sin in Genesis 3, reminds us that God loves us, while He abhors all that is evil. God hates sin because it required the sacrifice of His only begotten Son to rescue man from the eternal destruction which sin brings (John 3:16). We should have the same attitude about evil, because it will prevent our entrance into heaven.

Then Jesus said to them again, "I am going away, and you will seek Me, and will die in your sin. Where I go you cannot come." (John 8:21 NKJV)

Our claim of being an enlightened generation is completely refuted by the complacent attitude which many maintain toward evil. In no area of our lives is this generation less realistic, with less inclination to view the conditions in light of the facts, and to deal with them practically, than in matters that are evil.

Where sin is involved, many are sentimentalists who engage in wishful thinking. When someone might dare to picture the effects of sin in hard terms, they are accused of "over dramatization".

An unwillingness to view evil realistically carries serious consequences. The Bible warns us against "the devices of Satan" (2 Corinthians 2:11), and the "deceitfulness of sin" (Hebrews 3:13).

It seems that despite God's warnings, Satan has gained a definite advantage in that the ways by which many are blinded to the facts of evil today are as subtle as the evil one himself.

Our generation is constantly trying to endow evil persons and things with an irresistible glamour. Conduct which should cause the guilty party to be denounced by an enraged society is many times rationalized and "cloaked" in decency. Through this, the guilty are encouraged to be even more daring and reckless in their actions.

Also, in an effort to rid ourselves of the unpleasant fact of evil, some use synonyms which have "intellectual respectability". They speak of *aberration*, *abnormality*, or *mal-adjustment*. These words are used in a futile attempt to excuse inappropriate, and many times evil, behavior. But when the mask of mystery is removed from these terms, which can sound so convincing, we will see that man has only given a palatable term to something he knows is unpalatable.

These terms, and others like them, remove the ugliness of evil from the minds of some, in that they possess an intellectual flavor which the common word, *sin*, does not contain ... so it is less annoying to speak of aberration or mal-adjustment.

This practice emphasizes the danger in human theories concerning <u>spiritual</u> <u>matters</u>. For example, *aberration* is defined to mean "a departure from what is normal or desirable", "deviating from the right way; an error or mistake". Does not this remind us of the definition the Bible gives for sin?

Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. (1 John 3:4 NIV) All wrongdoing is sin, and there is sin that does not lead to death. (1 John 5:17 NIV)

Abnormality, which suggests that the person varies from the established type or standard, by failing to conform to rule, also suggests lawlessness. And maladjustment cries for guidance which can only be obtained from God...

O LORD, I know the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps. (Jeremiah 10:23 NKJV)

Another method through which some try to escape the reality of their evil deeds is through pride in human accomplishments. This manifests itself in their adopting an attitude of not allowing themselves to be bound by the restrictions of religion which their fathers endured.

While foolishly thinking that they have freed themselves from every barrier to complete happiness here on earth, they are now the prisoners of their own greed and lusts ... slaves of pleasure and exacting schedules, and in bondage to sin!

Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. (John 8:34 NIV)

God who pronounced a woe upon all them "that call evil good", has decreed;

"Behold, all souls are Mine; The soul of the father As well as the soul of the son is Mine; The soul who sins shall die. (Ezekiel 18:4 NKJV)

Since the "wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23), each of us should have our "senses trained to discern both good and evil" (Hebrews 5:14).

With David we should humbly state ...

Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You. (Psalms 119:11 NKJV)
