Finding Our Piece of the Wall...

At times a passage in my daily Bible reading will stick with me in a special way, typically because it resonates with a present situation. Such was the case this week in reading a passage from the book of Nehemiah.

As I read about the work of Nehemiah and the people in rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem, I considered the work to be done here at Washington.

So we built the wall. And all the wall was joined together to half its height, for the people had a mind to work. (Nehemiah 4:6)

Although our situation is very different than that of Nehemiah's day, in that we

are not faced with the daunting job of physically rebuilding walls around our city, we are however in a position to build our congregation spiritually by our working together to do the Will of the Lord. Spiritual growth often leads to physical growth.

Cooperation and Joint Participation

At the close of Nehemiah chapter 2, he had successfully persuaded the people of Judah to join him in rebuilding the wall. They intended to begin work, in spite of ridicule from their neighboring opponents. Here at Washington we enjoy the blessing of not being faced with the open obstacles faced by Nehemiah and those working with him. But, to paraphrase a famous quote, "our biggest obstacle will be us." Much like Nehemiah motivated the people, we must motivate ourselves to engage and accomplish the work before us.

One of the first things noticed in Nehemiah chapter 3 is the fantastic level of cooperation among God's people for the task. While the list of families participating in the rebuilding of the walls might not be exhaustive, it does offer an overall picture of the work in progress in that it is strikingly inclusive. The builders came from diverse regions of Judah (for example, the Tekoites in Nehemiah 3:5, and the inhabitants of Zanoah in Nehemiah 3:13), and from diverse professions (the goldsmiths and the perfumers, Nehemiah 3:8). Both sexes worked on the wall (Shallum and his daughters in Nehemiah 3:12), and even leaders from Judah got their hands dirty ... including the high priest and his brethren the priests (Nehemiah 3:1), the Levites (Nehemiah 3:17), and many district leaders (Nehemiah 3:9, Nehemiah 3:12, etc.).

In fact Malchijah, the "leader of the district of Beth Haccerem, repaired the Refuse Gate" (Nehemiah 3:14). This was probably not prime territory to work in ... downwind from the city dump ... but someone of authority, who might have used his influence to gain a better assignment, was willing to complete this necessary but less than desirable task.

Realizing That God Works Through Us

The story is told about a preacher from southern California who was intrigued by the lush forests of New England. He marveled that throughout the densely-overgrown region, one can see many small farms hewn out of the woods. While out on vacation one day he came

upon a farmer laboring in the fields. Eager to compliment his work the preacher stated, "Say, you and God have certainly done a wonderful job out here." With typical New England wit, the farmer responded, "Yeah, but you should have seen what God did by Himself." The wise farmer knew whose hands had done the work!

Likewise, rebuilding the wall in Jerusalem was God's work. God stirred up Nehemiah in chapter 1 and enabled him to be sent to Jerusalem in chapter 2. To his opponents, Nehemiah stated boldly, "The God of heaven Himself will prosper us; therefore we His servants will arise and build ..." (Nehemiah 2:20). Later when the wall was completed, Nehemiah commented that "this work was done by our God" (Nehemiah 6:16).

But God worked through people ... through Nehemiah and the hard working men and women of Judah. Nehemiah 3 should serve as a reminder to us that the work of God happens when the people of God labor. Of course God can do whatever He wishes, but usually He chooses to work through those who belong to Him, those who respond to His direction. This was true in the days of Nehemiah ... and it was true in the New Testament. It is still true today. Knowing that God works through us should encourage us ... and it should also motivate us to get busy with God's business.

I've stated that Nehemiah 3 is a reminder that the work of God happens when the people of God labor ... it is also a reminder that the work of God happens most effectively when everyone participates. Many may be willing, but they simply don't know where to start ... they can't find their piece of the wall.

I encourage each member of our congregation to consider the following...

Pray for God's guidance - We have many examples in the Bible of men and women who asked God for guidance in what to do for Him. Here we read of Moses' request of God...

Now therefore, I pray, if I have found grace in Your sight, show me now Your way, that I may know You and that I may find grace in Your sight." (Exodus 33:13 NKJV)

Look around Us - There may be opportunities for us to serve God right in front of us that we may miss because we are looking for our section of the wall elsewhere...

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.' (Matthew 25:37-40 NIV)

Be Determined – Much like Nehemiah and those working with him, we will face obstacles, and at times set-backs, when we dedicate ourselves to the work. The Apostle Paul offers these words of encouragement...

Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:58 NIV)

God intends to work in this world through us. And surely the church of Christ needs the participation of each member. When each member participates we all, individually and collectively, can experience the joy and fulfillment of contributing to God's work ... the growth of our fellow Christians ... and the growth of our local congregation!
